Refund of Caution Deposit Rules

- 1. It shall be the responsibility of the student to claim the refund of caution deposit paid by him / her for the particular course immediately at the end of the academic year in which the course is completed.
- 2. All claims for refund of caution deposit shall be preferred before the re-opening date of the next academic year in which the course is completed.
- 3. If the student takes T.C. before the completion of the course, the caution deposit will be refunded before the closing date of the college

CODE OF CONDUCT FOR STUDENTS

- 1. The day begins with a prayer at the college. During prayer, all the members of staff and students shall stand up and observe silence till the prayer is over. There shall be no movement of any kind in the college campus at this time

- 8. Students should always be respectful to their teachers, seniors and superiors, polite and courteous to all and should show themselves as lovers of decency and decorum.
- 9. Students shall co-operate with college authorities to ensure peaceful atmosphere congenial to the academic activities and overall developments of student and for the maintenance of discipline in the campus
- 10. Megaphones, Loudspeakers, Mobilephones etc. shall not be used. Posters, banners or boards should not be put up on the campus without permission of the principal.
- 11.Students will be allowed to bring their vehicles only up to the designated parking area. Entry beyond that point is strictly prohibited. Limited parking space is provided for students and the same can be utilised on a First Come First basis.

Conditions for Loan of Books

Period of loan for general books will be 14 days. Books on loan can be renewed for 14 days. The library staff may fix a shorter period of loan for a book that is in great demand, from circulation without assigning any reasons thereof. Defaulters will have to pay a fine of Rs.1 per day.

The loan facility is restricted to members only. They must borrow books personally.

- ★ Loose issues and bound volumes of periodicals are not issued out.
- ★ The librarian reserves the right to recall any book from any member at any time.
- * Books on loan may be renewed for further period provided that no other member had reserved the same.
- * Readers should verify the condition of the book, and should inform the librarian about the discrepancies, if any, before borrowing.

Loss of Books

- In case of loss of book the borrower shall replace the book within 20 days, and the defaulters will be charged 3 times the price of the book.
- If a book from a multiple volume set is damaged or lost, the member is liable to replace the whole set or pay the cost of the entire set. However, the librarian has the discretionary power to take the final decision.

General Rules

- All members are requested to maintain absolute silence in and around the library.
- Members shall not engage in conversation (including subject discussions) in any part of the library so as to cause annoyance to any other reader.
- Members shall not write upon, damage or mark any book belonging to the library.
- Users are not permitted to alter the arrangements of tables, chairs, etc., made in the library.
- Members shall not bring personal belongings (bags, text books, files, printed materials etc.) inside the library.
 Members may leave them at the property counter kept outside the library.
- The librarian reserves the right to suspend the membership of any member found misbehaving in the library.
- The members caught tearing pages of books/ stealing books will be suspended forthwith from using the library facilities and the library will recommend for further disciplinary action against them.

Periodical section

- 1. Periodicals will not be allowed to be taken out of the library They can be consulted in the library room during which the library remains open.
- 2. Readers should enter their names and details of the periodicals consulted in the Periodical Issue Register. Before leaving ,the readers must replace the periodicals properly in the Periodical Rack
